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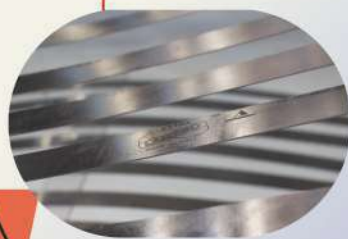

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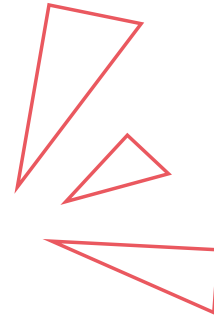

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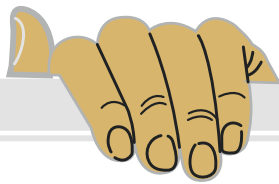


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From the Director's Desk

ABOUT THE INSTITUTE



Central Footwear Training Institute (CFTI)

- Chennai is a Govt. of India Society functioning under the aegis of Ministry of MSME (Micro Small and Medium Enterprises), as MSME - Technology Development Centre, a pioneer Institution rendering services in human resource development for footwear and allied industry through imparting various training programmes on Footwear Designing & Manufacturing Technology.
- This Institute came into existence in July 1957 in the name of Central Footwear Training Centre with the assistance of Ford Foundation engaged in providing trained manpower to the shoe industry. The departmentally run Central Footwear Training Centre was converted in to an autonomous Institution (A Government of India Society under Ministry of SSI) w.e.f. 1.1.96 for better functional autonomy. The Institute has been modernized by "National Leather Development Programme" (NLDP) Project during 1993 under the United Nations Development Program (UNIDO) and is fully equipped with state-of-the art machinery to impart training in the modern methods of Footwear manufacturing. The affairs of the Society are governed under the Chairmanship of Additional Secretary & Development Commissioner, (MSME), Ministry of Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises, and Govt. of India with an objective of quicker implementation of managerial decisions followed by Governing Council members from Govt. of India, State Government of Tamil Nadu and from the Industry.
- CFTI situated in the Prime location of Guindy at Chennai having the state of Art Infrastructure for machinery and facilities to train in the area of footwear science and engineering. The facilities includes modern classrooms, workshop with world class Footwear Machines, 3 D Shoe CAD/CAM lab for Shoe Design & Development, Common facility services and all other students amenities like library, Sports centre, conference hall and Student's hostel.
- CFTI conducts various Long term, Short term and Part time techno managerial courses in Footwear, Leather Goods and allied subjects. This Institute also conducts various NSQF approved short term courses, Customised courses and part time evening courses based on the jobrole demand of the Industry for freshers, Semi-skilled people as well as entrepreneurs.

Assistance to Training Institutions (ATI)

75 candidates at the Vaniyambadi Multi-Skill Development Centre (CFTI Extension Centre) successfully completed the Skill Training Programme under the Assistance to Training Institutions (ATI) Scheme for the NSQF-approved job role of Stitching Operator Footwear (LSS/Q2501). A total of 150 candidates have completed the training programme in the financial year 2024-25. The scheme aims to strengthen both physical infrastructure and human resources (HR) in national-level institutions under the Ministry of MSME to enhance skill development.

Skill Training under the SHG Program

Under the SC/ST Fee Reimbursement Scheme, skill training programmes have been provided to 422 candidates in NSQF-approved job roles, with 371 candidates newly enrolled this quarter. (சைவ தோல் - எட்டாவது தொடர்)

மாதுளை தோல் என்பது மாதுளையின் தோலில் இருந்து தயாரிக்கப்படும் ஒரு வகை நிலையான தோல் மாற்றாகும். இந்த புதுமையான ஆராய்ச்சி பாரம்பரிய விலங்கு தோலுக்கு சுற்றுச்சூழல் நட்பு மாற்றீட்டை வழங்குகிறது. தோல் உற்பத்தியின் சுற்றுச்சூழல் தாக்கத்தைக் குறைக்கும் நோக்கில் தாவர அடிப்படையிலான தோல் மாற்றுகளின் ஒரு பகுதியாகும்.



மாதுளை தோலுக்கான உற்பத்தி செயல்முறை:

பொதுவாக கழிவுகளாக அப்புறப்படுத்தப்படும் மாதுளைத் தோல்கள், பழம் அறுவடை செய்யப்பட்ட பிறகு சேகரிக்கப்படுகின்றன. இந்தத் தோல்களை பதனிடுதல் செய்கிறார்கள் இது தோல் தயாரிக்கும் செயல்முறைக்கு அவசியமானது.

தோல்களை பதப்படுத்துதல்

பின்னர் அழுக்கு அகற்ற தோல்கள் சுத்தம் செய்யப்படுகின்றன. அதன்பின் சுத்தம் செய்யப்பட்ட

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FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT

In business, financial management is the practice of handling a company's finances in a way that allows it to be successful and compliant with regulations. That takes both a high-level plan and boots-on-the-ground execution.

What Is Financial Management?

At its core, financial management is the practice of making a business plan and then ensuring all departments stay on track. Solid financial management enables the CFO or VP of finance to provide data that supports creation of a long-range vision, informs decisions on where to invest, and yields insights on how to fund those investments, liquidity, profitability, cash runway and more.

ERP software can help finance teams achieve these goals: A financial management system combines several financial functions, such as accounting, fixed-asset management, revenue recognition and payment processing. By integrating these key components, a financial management system ensures real-time visibility into the financial state of a company while facilitating day-to-day operations, like period-end close processes.



Objectives of Financial Management

Building on those pillars, financial managers help their companies in a variety of ways, including but not limited to:

- Maximizing profits: Provide insights on, for example, rising costs of raw materials that might trigger an increase in the cost of goods sold.
- Tracking liquidity and cash flow: Ensure the company has enough money on hand to meet its obligations.
- Ensuring compliance: Keep up with state, federal and industry-specific regulations.
- Developing financial scenarios: These are based on the business' current state and forecasts that assume a wide range of outcomes based on possible market conditions.
- Manage relationships: Dealing effectively with investors and the boards of directors.



Scope of Financial Management

Financial management encompasses four major areas:

Planning

The financial manager projects how much money the company will need in order to maintain positive cash flow, allocate funds to grow or add new products or services and cope with unexpected events, and shares that information with business colleagues.

Planning may be broken down into categories including capital expenses, T&E and workforce and indirect and operational expenses.

Budgeting

The financial manager allocates the company's available funds to meet costs, such as mortgages or rents, salaries, raw materials, employee T&E and other obligations. Ideally there will be some left to put aside for emergencies and to fund new business opportunities.

Companies generally have a master budget and may have separate sub documents covering, for example, cash flow and operations; budgets may be static or flexible.

Managing and assessing risk

Line-of-business executives look to their financial managers to assess and provide compensating controls for a variety of risks, including:

Market risk

Affects the business' investments as well as, for public companies, reporting and stock performance. May also reflect financial risk particular to the industry, such as a pandemic affecting restaurants or the shift of retail to a direct-to-consumer model.



Credit risk

The effects of, for example, customers not paying their invoices on time and thus the business not having funds to meet obligations, which may adversely affect creditworthiness and valuation, which dictates ability to borrow at favorable rates.

Liquidity risk

Finance teams must track current cash flow, estimate future cash needs and be prepared to free up working capital as needed.

Operational risk

This is a catch-all category, and one new to some finance teams. It may include, for example, the risk of a cyber-attack and whether to purchase cybersecurity insurance, what disaster recovery and business continuity plans are in place and what crisis management practices are triggered if a senior executive is accused of fraud or misconduct.

Procedures

The financial manager sets procedures regarding how the finance team will process and distribute financial data, like invoices, payments and reports, with security and accuracy. These written procedures also outline who is responsible for making financial decisions at the company — and who signs off on those decisions.

Companies don't need to start from scratch; there are policy and procedure templates available for a variety of organization types, such as this one for nonprofits.

Functions of Financial Management

More practically, a financial manager's activities in the above areas revolve around planning and forecasting and controlling expenditures.

The FP&A function includes issuing P&L statements, analyzing which product lines or services have the highest profit margin or contribute the most to net profitability, maintaining the budget and forecasting the company's future financial performance and scenario planning.

Managing cash flow is also key. The financial manager must make sure there's enough cash on hand for day-to-day operations, like paying workers and purchasing raw materials for production. This involves overseeing cash as it flows both in and out of the business, a practice called cash management.

Along with cash management, financial management includes revenue recognition, or reporting the company's revenue according to standard accounting principles. Balancing accounts receivable turnover ratios is a key part of strategic cash conservation and management. This may sound simple, but it isn't always: At some companies, customers might pay months after receiving your service. At what point do you consider that money "yours" — and report the good news to investors?

5 Tips to Improve Your Accounts Receivable Turnover Ratio

- Invoice regularly and accurately. If invoices don't go out on time, money will not come in on time.
- Always state payment terms. You can't enforce policies that you haven't communicated to clients. If you make changes, call them out.
- Offer multiple ways to pay. New B2B options are coming online. Have you considered a payment gateway?
- Set follow-up reminders. Don't wait until customers are in arrears to start collection procedures. Be proactive, but not annoying, with reminders.
- Consider offering discounts for cash and prepayments. Cash(less) is king in retail, and you can reduce AR costs by encouraging customers to pay ahead rather than on your normal customer credit terms.

Importance of Financial Management

Solid financial management provides the foundation for three pillars of sound fiscal governance:

Strategizing

Identifying what needs to happen financially for the company to achieve its short- and long-term goals. Leaders need insights into current performance for scenario planning, for example.

Decision-making

Helping business leaders decide the best way to execute on plans by providing up-to-date financial reports and data on relevant KPIs.

Controlling

Ensuring each department is contributing to the vision and operating within budget and in alignment with strategy.

LEATHER INDUSTRY IN INDIA

The Leather industry, Leather Products, and Footwear Industry of India hold a prominent place in the Indian economy. This industry is among the top ten foreign exchange earners for the nation and is renowned for its constancy in producing significant export revenues.

The Leather industry in India accounts for around 13% of the world's leather production of hides/skins and handles a robust annual production of about 3 bn sq. ft. of leather.

India is the second-largest exporter of leather garments, third-largest exporter of Saddlery and harnesses, and 4th largest exporter of Leather Goods in the world. The export of footwear, leather and leather products from India was to the tune of US \$ 4.6 billion during fiscal year 2024.

- The industry is bestowed with an affluence of raw materials as India is endowed with
- 20% of the world's buffalo (First in the total buffalo population in the world - 109.85 million buffaloes)
- 11% of the world's goat (Second in the population of goats - 148.88 million goats)
- Third in the population of sheep (74.26 millions)
- Added to this are the strengths of skilled manpower, innovative technology, increasing industry compliance with international environmental standards, and the dedicated support of the allied industries.

Leather industry in India

The leather industry is an employment-intensive sector, providing jobs to about 4.42 million people, mostly from the weaker sections of society. Women's employment is predominant in the leather products sector with about 30% share.

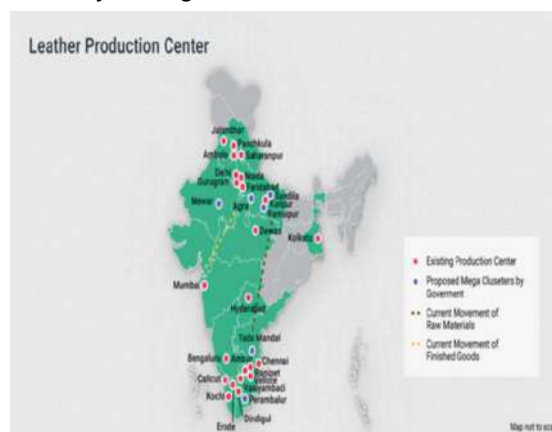
India has four main leather sectors:

1. Tanning
2. Footwear
3. Leather Garments
4. Leather garments and Accessories.

The country accounts for 13% of the world's total leather production. It is also the second-largest producer and consumer of leather footwear.

The major production centers for footwear, leather, and leather products in India are located in the States:

- Tamil Nadu-Chennai, Ambur, Ranipet, Vaniyambadi, Vellore, Pernambut, Trichy, Dindigul and Erode;
- West Bengal-Kolkata;
- Uttar Pradesh-Kanpur, Agra, Noida, Saharanpur;
- Maharashtra-Mumbai;
- Punjab-Jalandhar;
- Karnataka-Bengaluru;
- Telangana- Hyderabad;
- Haryana-Ambala, Gurgaon, Panchkula, Karnal, and Faridabad;
- Delhi;
- Madhya Pradesh-Dewas;
- Kerala-Kozhikode and Ernakulam / Cochin;
- Rajasthan-Jaipur;
- Jammu & Kashmir-Srinagar.



India is the second-largest exporter of leather garments, the third-largest exporter of saddlery & harnesses, and the fourth-largest exporter of leather goods in the world.

- The garments sector accounted for 6.8% of the country's total leather exports in 2024-25.
- Out of the total leather and leather products exported out of India, the footwear segment accounts for the majority of exports

India exports leather to more than 50 countries.

- USA, Germany, the UK, Italy, France, Spain, Netherlands, China, Belgium, UAE, Australia, Poland, Hong Kong, Denmark, Canada, Vietnam, and Portugal are among the top importers of leather and leather products from India.
- The USA is the largest importer of leather and leather products from India.



INDIA'S EXPORTS TO OTHER COUNTRIES

India as Footwear hub

- The country accounts for 9% of the world's footwear production and is the second largest footwear producer and consumer in the world.
- India is the Second largest footwear producer after China, with Annual Production of 2.58 billion pairs. India is also the second largest consumer of footwear after China, with a consumption of 2.60 billion pairs.
- For every 1,000 pairs produced and sold in India per day, the sector has the potential to create 425 jobs spanning manufacturing, allied industries, and retail.
- In terms of volume, India is expected to produce almost 3 bn units by 2024 growing at more than 10% annually.

Strengths of the Indian leather industry

- Own raw material source - About 3 billion sq ft of leather are produced annually.
- Some varieties of goat/calf/sheep skins command premium position.
- Strong and eco-sustainable tanning base.
- Modernized manufacturing units.
- Trained / skilled manpower at competitive wage levels.
- World-class institutional support for Design & Product Development, HRD, and R & D.
- Presence of support industries like leather chemicals and finishing auxiliaries
- Presence in major markets - Long Europe experience.
- Strategic location in the Asian landmass.

Government initiatives for the leather industry

Indian Footwear and Leather Development Programme (IFLDP)

The IFLDP scheme was launched to develop the infrastructure, increase production, facilitate investments and generate employment in the leather industry of India. Under this scheme, Rs. 1,700 crores (US\$ 220 million) has been allocated till 2026. Following are the six sub-schemes under IFLDP:

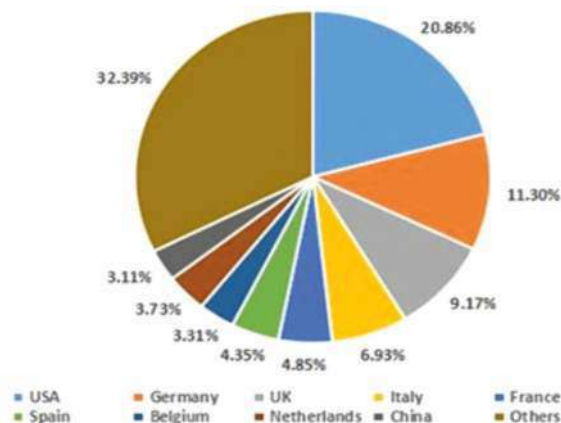
- 1. Sustainable Technology and Environmental Protection (STEP)** - The STEP initiative is aimed at sustainable and environment-friendly industrial and tanning activities which are particularly linked to environmental concerns. Considering these issues, zero liquid and wastewater discharge is made mandatory in some states. Assistance for the upgradation of Common Effluent Treatment Plants (CETPs) and vision document preparation is provided under the scheme.
- 2. Integrated Development of Leather Sector (IDLS)** - The main objective of this scheme is to encourage entrepreneurs to diversify and set up new units leading to better productivity.
- 3. Establishment of Institutional Facilities** - The scheme aims to provide infrastructure upgradation of campuses of the Footwear Design and Development Institute (FDDI).
- 4. Mega Leather Footwear and Accessories Cluster Development (MLFACD)** - The scheme is launched to assist entrepreneurs by providing modern infrastructure, technology, training and skill development, and human resource development inputs.
- 5. Brand Promotion of Indian Brands in Leather** - The scheme aims to provide Indian footwear and leather manufacturers international branding support to provide better product visibility.
- 6. Footwear Sector and Development of Design Studios** - This scheme will provide design support, technical assistance, and opportunities for employment and business.

The Government of India had identified the Leather & Footwear Sector as one of the 12 Focus Sectors where India can be a Global Supplier.

The Indian leather industry seeks to increase production, improve export, and ultimately create more jobs through the implementation of various industrial development programs and export promotion initiatives.

हाल ही में केंद्र सरकार ने 31 मार्च, 2026 या अगली समीक्षा तक 'भारतीय फुटवियर और चमड़ा विकास कार्यक्रम (Indian Footwear and Leather Development Programme- IFLDP)' योजना को जारी रखने की मंजूरी दी है।

IFLDP को पूर्ववर्ती IFLADP (भारतीय फुटवियर, चमड़ा और सहायक उपकरण विकास कार्यक्रम) की निरंतरता के रूप में अनुमोदित किया गया था।

भारतीय फुटवियर और चमड़ा विकास कार्यक्रम (IFLDP):

परिचय:

यह एक केंद्रीय क्षेत्र की योजना है, जिसका उद्देश्य चमड़ा क्षेत्र के लिये बुनियादी ढाँचे का विकास करना, चमड़ा क्षेत्र की विशिष्ट पर्यावरणीय चिंताओं को दूर करना, अतिरिक्त निवेश की सुविधा, रोज़गार सृजन और उत्पादन में वृद्धि करना है।

इसे वाणिज्य एवं उद्योग मंत्रालय के अंतर्गत उद्योग एवं आंतरिक व्यापार संवर्द्धन विभाग द्वारा लॉन्च किया गया था। भारत के चमड़ा उद्योग की वर्तमान स्थिति:

भारत में चमड़ा उद्योग की हिस्सेदारी वैश्विक चमड़ा उत्पादन का लगभग 13% है और यहाँ लगभग 3 बिलियन वर्ग फीट चमड़े का वार्षिक उत्पादन होता है।

यह उद्योग उच्च निर्यात आय में अपनी निरंतरता के लिये जाना जाता है और यह देश के लिये शीर्ष 10 विदेशी मुद्रा अर्जकों में से एक है।

भारत में चमड़े संबंधी कच्चे माल की प्रचुरता है और इसका कारण है कि भारत में विश्व के 20% मवेशी और भैंस तथा 11% बकरी और भेड़ की आबादी है।

चमड़ा उद्योग एक रोज़गार सघन उद्योग है जो 4 मिलियन से अधिक लोगों को रोज़गार प्रदान करता है, जिनमें से अधिकांश समाज के कमज़ोर वर्गों से हैं।

लगभग 30% हिस्सेदारी के साथ चमड़ा उत्पाद उद्योग में महिला रोज़गार प्रमुख है।

भारत के चमड़ा उद्योग में 35 वर्ष से कम आयु के 55% कार्यबल के साथ सबसे कम उम्र का कार्यबल है।

वर्ष 2022 तक भारत दुनिया में जूते और चमड़े के कपड़ों का दूसरा सबसे बड़ा उत्पादक, चमड़े के कपड़ों का दूसरा सबसे बड़ा निर्यातक और चमड़े की वस्तु एवं एक्सेसरीज़ का पाँचवाँ सबसे बड़ा निर्यातक है।

भारत में चमड़े और जूते के उत्पादों के प्रमुख उत्पादन केंद्र तमिलनाडु, आंध्र प्रदेश, पश्चिम बंगाल, उत्तर प्रदेश, महाराष्ट्र, पंजाब, हरियाणा और दिल्ली में स्थित हैं।

भारतीय चमड़ा और फुटवियर उत्पादों के प्रमुख बाज़ार अमेरिका, जर्मनी, ब्रिटेन, इटली, फ्रांस, स्पेन, नीदरलैंड, संयुक्त अरब अमीरात, चीन, हॉंगकॉंग, बेल्जियम और पोलैंड हैं।

संयुक्त राज्य अमेरिका भारत से चमड़ा और चमड़े के उत्पादों का सबसे बड़ा आयातक है तथा अप्रैल-अगस्त 2022 के दौरान देश के कुल चमड़े के निर्यात का 25.19% का निर्यात किया गया।
